AND A HAPPY NEW YEAR...

As we stride into 2014 we have many uncharted waters ahead. This applies to ABCDreams (UK) as much as to everyone of us. Last year was our first year of operations, the results of which we saw this month (February, 2014) in benefits to three schools in Lyamungo Sinde.

I started the project thinking that I would support the children of the whole village here and of course, that includes children attending the other two schools in the village apart from Lyamungo Sinde Primary.

At the start of this year I first met with Pastor Nickson, the village pastor at the Lutheran Church to discuss the children we should support. He is familiar with all the children and has been very helpful to ABCDreams (UK). We then arranged a meeting with village officials and the three head teachers to agree the lists of



children in need in their respective schools. The results of these consultations have meant that we now support 65 children and their families with payment of the majority of school fees for these children.

Last week I met with the head teachers at L.S. and Mwowe Primary Schools to facilitate payments. This week I visit the third school -ARI, standing for Agricultural Research Institute School - very exiting times for the village!

Meanwhile, during our December visit to London, my wife and I visited Roxwell Primary School in Essex with which, if you remember, we began twinning events last year. We were very happy to see a Lyamungo Sinde bulletin board at the school with the pictures that L.S. students painted and including photos of L.S. primary children for their Roxwell

During our visit we also exchanged calendars - one developed by the Roxwell children showing monthly events at the school and one consisting of the paintings done by standard 7 pupils at L.S. Primary. It is my hope that we might be able to arrange a fund-raising event this year at Roxwell where we can exchange art works by both schools and raise funds for L.S. Primary at the same time. By the way, we found through enquiries that the difference in pupil allocation grants between the schools runs at approximately £1 in Tanzania for every £215 in the UK!

Judging by the very good start to this year then, 2014 promises to be a busy year for us. With the school events mentioned above, with Martha's teaching in the village for the next 6 months, with the continuation of the Art projects begun last year with both standard 4 and 6 (now std 5 and 7 respectively), we remain with a good deal of work to do to enhance the education of students not only here in Africa but also hopefully in Roxwell.
